Buddy



Lola



WESTIE IN THE KITCHEN



Homemade Dog Treats-Oatmeal/Carrot/Cinnamon Crispies

Ingredients:

3 Cups Oatmeal, uncooked

1 1/2 Cups gluten free flour or mix in flax seed meal

½ cup mashed carrots. Squash, spinach, pumpkin, unsweetened applesauce,

Sweet potatoes (Decrease water by $\frac{1}{2}$ cup or so)

1 1/2 Cup cold water

1 Tsp. Cinnamon (optional, I use)

1 Teaspoon baking soda

1 Tablespoon parsley, chopped (optional)

2 Egg yolks or ½ cup egg beater (optional)

Directions:

Mix all ingredients together. Spoon onto a greased cookie sheet. Bake 12 to 15 minutes at 375 degrees. To make crisper (Max likes them crispy - leave in warm oven a while. When cool, Store in open container (for crispiness).
