Jenny is a sweet sweet, sweet friendly Westie girl from a local shelter. Jenny was stray and when her people were found they signed her over saying they could not care for her. She had serious skin problems (hair loss) and mats. Jenny has been adopted by her foster Dad where she has spent months being rehabilitated. As you see her fur is returning. Her foster dad says she is the sweetest girl ever.

Maggie is a wonderful Westie mix. She was given to rescue by her owner who found she was too active for her household and older dog. Maggie is just 2 years old. She is enjoying life with her new family and 5 year old Westie brother. Maggie and her brother can play for hours and enjoys long walks and an active life.

Gemma is a beautiful little girl from an east bay shelter with a bad skin infection and hair loss. Gemma is in a foster home and has months of recovery ahead of her. WESTIE HEALTH CORNER

What do Titer Tests Cost?

Testing costs vary widely from practice to practice, so shop around. Some vets do in-house testing. Others use outside labs. Some mark up tests and services a little; others, a lot.

You should be able to have parvo/distemper tests done most places for less than \$100.

Rabies tests, on the other hand, can cost considerably more, in large part because they are sent overnight to a lab. (Ask your vet to have a Titer Testing Day so that they can send multiple tests in one package and save.
